## **Background**

The World Health Organization (WHO), the Africa Evidence Network (AEN) and Cochrane are committed to strengthening practices of citizen engagement (CE) in evidence-informed decision-making (EIDM) to advance its mission for delivering measurable impact and supporting countries on the road to the Sustainable Development Goals.

While CE is vital for health policy decision-making, the field of EIDM has primarily focused on translating research evidence into policy, with less emphasis on public participation. To address this gap, we are creating a *community of practice (CoP) on citizen engagement in evidence-informed decision-making in the health sector (CE-EIDM)*. Through this CoP, participants are expected to strengthen their capacity to promote CE in their own contexts, fostering stronger social participation in policy processes.

## **Meeting objectives**

The first six meetings of the CoP CE-EIDM will consist of capacity building activities and debates to set up the CoP. The first meeting aims to

- provide an overview of the CoP and its objectives;
- develop the vision of the CoP; and
- discuss next steps in the development of the CoP, including the workplan, working groups and engagement platforms.
