With the theme "Ear and hearing care for all!", we focus on ensuring access to ear and hearing care services to all who need it, as an essential health service.








Call to action for governments, industry partners, and civil society!



- Ear and hearing problems are among the most common health issues encountered in the community.
- Over 60% of these can be identified and addressed at the primary level of care.
- Integration of ear and hearing care into primary care services is possible through training and capacity building at this level.
- Such integration will benefit people and help countries move towards the goal of universal health coverage.

# WHO PRIMARY EAR AND HEARING CARE TRAINING MANUAL




- The manual is a practical guide on preventing, identifying, and managing hearing loss and common ear diseases that lead to hearing loss.

## WHO PRIMARY EAR AND HEARING CARE TRAINER'S HANDBOOK




- The trainer's handbook accompanies the Primary ear and hearing care training manual.

- It includes guidance on structuring the training course, a suggested timetable and additional resources.


