





Support for the One Health Approach


Facilitates better management of zoonotic diseases by integrating human, animal, and environmental health strategies.

Challenges

January 24, 2025

Limited Intersectoral Coordination

A significant challenge is the lack of effective communication and collaboration across different sectors involved in One Health.

Need for Capacity-Building

There is a pressing requirement for capacity-building initiatives at subnational levels to ensure comprehensive workforce development.

Funding and Resource Gaps

Insufficient funding and resources pose a barrier to effective training and development of One Health professionals.

Navigating Complex Systems

The complexity of existing health systems can hinder the implementation of integrated workforce development strategies.



Recommendations

Prioritizing the integration of the WFD OT into national health and workforce policies.



Advocating for the allocation of resources specifically for training and workforce development.



Continuous Learning Opportunities

Encouraging ongoing learning through follow-up workshops and the use of online platforms.


