Climate Resilient Health Systems, 9:30-10:45

This event will showcase country examples in delivering COP26 health commitments, and reflect on key actions needed to achieve climate resilient health systems.

Low Carbon Sustainable Health Systems, 11:15-12:30
Health systems worldwide are working on mitigating their impact on climate change, including through health system decarbonization and low carbon development.
Sustainable finance and resource mobilization, 13:30-14:45
The event will discuss ATACH and COP29 facilitating access to financing matching country demands, and identify priorities and impediments for countries to access climate and health finance, so as to deliver a shift in the international financial architecture available for climate change and health.
Maximizing Health Co-benefits: Linking Climate Action to Public Health Gains, 15:15-16:30
This session will explore health co-benefits by examining how they can act as a catalyst for stronger climate action.
Embedding gender and equity in climate and health action, 17:00-18:15
