

Understanding public & HCW perception and concern over time, language and geographies




#### Proportion of social media mentions of monkeypox vs. COVID-19 vs. all social media conversation: 16 May - 14 August 2022\*







### Early outbreak: social media mentions 16May – 14 Aug 2022








Volume of mpox social media conversation on mpox in South America: 03 November 2022 – 30 January 2023




Top locations for social media conversation on mpox in Latin America: 17 January - 30 January 2023

Most common topics of concern:

- At risk women and mpox
- Persistent stigmatization of LGBTQI+community
- Polarised opinion on mpox vaccines access

#### Volume of mpox social media mentions among HCWs (English, French, Spanish): 23 July 2022 - 15 December 2022










#### Volume of mpox knowledge social media mentions posted by HCWs (English, French & Spanish): 23 July 2022 - 15 December 2022
