- Part of the WHO commitment to promote and secure mobile populations' health rights, as described in the WHO GAP for Promoting the Health of Refugees and Migrants.

The reviews of the Series:

- Include both academic and grey literature
- Written for policy-makers and research communities
- Do not provide WHO recommendations but proposes policy considerations.
- A key step towards WHO recommendations, guidance, or guideline development
- GEHMs' findings will contribute to the prioritization process and shaping up PHM research agenda
- Indexed in the NCBI Bookshelf and made searchable and discoverable via PubMed

Global Evidence Reviews on Health and Migration (GEHM) Methodology

Evidence gathering

- specific search strategy is developed, including the list of potential sources for the literature review and grey literature search
- literature and systematic reviews; review of reviews; scoping review, etc.

· Screening criteria

- criteria and the underlying rationale, including languages

• Evidence synthesis

- analyze findings to answer the policy question

Policy considerations

- develop a set of policy considerations based on the findings

Public Digital Health Technology from the Department of Digital Health and Innovation (DHI):


to advise PHM on the use of digital health and related innovative technologies for evidence gathering, preparing smart guidelines etc.
