Objectives of the WHO Global COVID-19 Vaccination Strategy July 2021 Update

- Inform the decisions countries are making regarding their vaccination goals and targets for 2022 and beyond;
- Promote an equitable approach to COVID-19 vaccination globally, as part of the broader pandemic control strategy;
- Update global vaccination goal for 2022, based on specific changes in the global context and in light of key uncertainties;
- Inform global policymaking and access efforts, investment decisions by financial and donor institutions, R&D groups and vaccine manufacturers as well as country planning and programmatic work.

Objectives of the Roadmap for prioritizing uses of COVID-19 vaccines in the context of limited supply

- Support countries in planning, suggest public health strategies and target priority groups for different levels of vaccine availability and different epidemiological settings.
- 2. Provide guidance to countries on vaccine prioritization decisions.
- 3. Build on the **values framework** for the allocation and prioritization of COVID-19 vaccination and contemporary understanding of the burden of disease in different population groups.
- To contribute to **global equity** by emphasizing a priority-driven approach to vaccination.

Scope of the conceptual goal framework provided by Global Vaccination Strategy



The goal framework...

- Is a strategic tool to inform global level discussion, capturing country and region variability in the analysis
- Makes simplifying assumptions in order to provide strategic insights and quantify magnitude of resources needed



The goal framework is not...

- Providing policy recommendations
- Taking into account all dimensions for prioritizing groups within broad age categories (e.g., sociodemographic or occupational characteristics)



Scope of the Roadmap



The Roadmap is to....

- Support country decision-making on prioritization of populations for vaccination under different supply scenarios;
- Consider more nuanced information on burden of disease and social consequences;
- It builds on universally accepted values and preferences



The Roadmap is not to....

- Guide global allocation of vaccines;
- Set targets and global or country goals for vaccinations
- Make estimates on resources requirements;



The Global vaccination strategy helps set the goalpost ...

- Which goal should country pursue with their vaccination programme?
- What are the main areas of uncertainty?
- What are the resources required and what is feasible?
- What should be the global goal for collective country action?

... and the Roadmap complements it by answering some questions on the how to reach it

- Which priority groups should a country target under its specific circumstances to reach its goalpost?
- Which priority order should be followed?
- What is the justification for prioritizing certain population groups?
