Your next newsletter, coming soon after 5 May - will share information about commitment from around the world!

- 1. The WHO 5 May 2014 global surveys deadline for data submission extended to 15 June 2014 due to overwhelming interest!
  - Laboratory-based Survey on MULTIDRUG-RESISTANT ORGANISMS (MDROs) in Health Care to assess and raise awareness of the prevalence of the five main health care-associated MDROs identified at global level.
  - Survey on the use of SURGICAL ANTIBIOTIC PROPHYLAXIS to assess surgical antibiotic prophylaxis prescribing in a wide range of acute health-care facilities.

The interim results of the two WHO Global surveys will be available <a href="here">here</a> and will be discussed by Professor Pittet in his Special Teleclass for 5 May. Given the high interest in participation, we have decided to keep the online submissions **open until 15 June 2014**. Therefore, you can still participate and encourage others to do the same! Take the chance to add to the 1500 health-care facilities that have already submitted data!
