

### KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

01

By the end of 2024, the entire number of family physicians in Jordan (both specialists and residents) were trained on mhGAP.

Jordan established 66 mental health clinics, a 27% increase since 2022, with a stronger focus on community-based care.

03

Jordan launched its Mental Health Investment Case in August 2024, securing high-level support and reinforcing the need for sustained funding and policy action.



### POLICYAND ADVOCACY

Mental health promotion was integrated into multiple regional and international forums, including the WHO-UNICEF Joint Programme on Child and Adolescent Mental Health.

Learnings from the rapid mid term evaluation for National Mental Health and Substance Use Action Plan 2022-2026, conducted as part of the WHO/UNICEF Joint program, yielded key learnings and provided a comprehensive analysis of the plan's effectiveness, identified key challenges and successes, and offered actionable recommendations for future implementation

Seven WHO QualityRights standards have been integrated into primary healthcare quality indicators to ensure rights-based, high-quality mental health services.

Mental health has been integrated into Jordan's national health assessments and primary healthcare package, with an evaluation highlighting progress, gaps, and key areas for improvement.



## SCALING UP MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Following a needs assessment, an inpatient mental health unit is being established at Al Yarmouk General Hospital, addressing service gaps in the northern region.

The government has committed to a structured approach to mental health investment, ensuring financial and policy sustainability.

The technical mental health committee has been activated, with recommendations to revise its membership to ensure full representation of stakeholders and regular meetings.

Jordan has successfully completed mhGAP trainings, reaching 1,120 primary healthcare workers across 278 centers, covering 41% of Primary Health Care services.



# CAPACITY BUILDING

Integration of Mental Health in the Residency Program: In collaboration with the National Center for Mental Health, child psychiatry training was institutionalized within medical residency programs, strengthening long-term mental health capacity.

A high-level advisory team was formed under the umbrella of the Higher Council of Science and Technology, where a national roadmap to guide the advancement of mental health support in Jordan has been drafted.



- Renovation and procurement to ensure the unit is operational by mid-2025.
- Inclusion of mental health indicators in national health facility assessments to improve monitoring and evaluation.
- Continued advocacy to secure financial commitments for long-term mental health investment.
- Address existing gaps in mental health data reporting for better service planning and evaluation.
