Highlights:

- There has been an increase in weekly reported cases, with 458 new cases in the reporting week compared to 210 in the week before and TPR over 2%; Over 92 percent of the newly reported cases are from Dhaka city.
- Health authorities are calling for greater vigilance and compliance with COVID-19 preventive measures including mask wearing, hygiene and vaccination
- During the countrywide COVID-19 immunization booster campaign week (4 June 2022 10 June 2022), over 10.8 million doses were administered; national coverage of full dose vaccination is 69.5 percent.

Global & Regional Situation

- Globally, as of 12 June 2022, there have been 532 677 229 (207 339) confirmed cases of COVID 19, including 6 306 670 (493) deaths reported to WHO through national authorities.
- Most of the cases have been reported from the USA, with 84 292 712 cases and 1 000 850 deaths, followed by India with 43 222 017 cases and the third-highest death count of 524 761. Brazil reported the third-highest case of 31 315 777 and the second-highest death of 667 647.


The map below shows the distribution of new cases of COVID-19 reported across the globe, as of 12 June 2022

- The number of new weekly cases has continued the declining trend observed since a peak in January 2022. During the week of 6 June through 12 June 2022, over 2.8 million cases were reported. The number of new weekly deaths also continues to decline, with over 7.6 thousand fatalities reported.
- In the WHO South-East Asia Region, there were 67 795 new cases and 261 new deaths reported during the reporting week. Bangladesh (458 new cases), India (45 200 new cases), Indonesia (3 688 new cases), Sri Lanka (81 new cases) and Maldives (124 new cases) reported an increase in new cases, while the remaining countries reported a decline.

The figure below shows the 7-day moving average of COVID-19 cases per 100 000 population in the past 3 weeks




Bangladesh Situation:

Surveillance & Laboratory

- Between 8 March 2020 and 12 June 2022, 1 954 115 COVID-19 cases were confirmed by RT-PCR, GeneXpert, and Rapid Antigen tests, including 29 131 related deaths (CFR 1.49%).
- In the past week (epidemiological week 23, 2022), Bangladesh reported 458 new cases, while 210 cases reported in the week before; the case rate per 100 000 population per week is **0.27**. The country reported **no** new death in the reporting week.
- Health authorities are working to unravel the cause of this increase but call for vigilance and compliance with COVID-19 protocols


The graphs below show the daily Tests and TPR for COVID-19 in Bangladesh, 13 MAY - 12 JUN 2022


The weekly new test is 35 377 (daily average: 5 054), a 5.6% increase compared to the previous week; the test rate per 100 000 per week is 20.8; the weekly average test positivity rate (TPR) is 1.29%, TPR increased by 106.5% from the previous week. The overall Case Fatality Ratio (CFR) is stable at 1.49%.

- As of 12 June 2022, according to the DGHS Press Release, **14 181 774** COVID-19 tests (RT-PCR **89.1**%, GeneXpert **0.9**%, and Rapid Antigen **10.0**%) were conducted in Bangladesh with an overall positivity rate of 13.78% and **2.06**% in the last 24 hours.
- Currently, there are **879** government or private laboratories/test centres in the country distributed as RT-PCR **56**/160, GeneXpert **54**/57, and Rapid Antigen **545**/662, respectively. Sixty six percent of all tests since the outbreak have been done in government facilities.

2. Case Management and Infection Prevention & Control

- As of 12 June 2022, there are **13 024** general beds dedicated to COVID-19 treatment countrywide, 0.4% (**55**/13 024) of which are occupied. The Rajshahi division experienced the overall highest, **2.4**% (**8**/337) general bed occupancy. Number of occupied general beds in the country **increased** from 48 last week to 55 this week.
- There are 1 173 dedicated ICU beds in the country, the majority of which are in Dhaka city (61.4%) and Chattogram (5.5%) and with overall occupancy of 1.5% (18/1 173). The Rangpur division experienced the overall highest, 9.1% (4/44) ICU bed occupancy. Number of occupied ICU beds increased from 16 last week to 18 this week.

3. Vaccination

- As of 12 June 2022, 128 898 093 individuals received their first dose, 118 390 624 completed their two-dose schedule, and 26 891 719 individuals received the COVID-19 booster dose.
- More than 75.7% of the total population received the first dose, and 69.5% completed two-dose schedule (as per the estimated population of 170 317 066, by Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics, 28 December 2021).
- The male and female ratio was 49.8% and 50.2% among the people who received the first dose and 49.5% and 50.5% respectively for the second dose.


