Agenda item 8.2: Annual report on monitoring progress on UHC and health-related SDGs (SEA/RC77/10)

The International Alliance of Patients' Organizations (IAPO) has been advocating for patient-centred healthcare for 25 years and fully supports the ongoing efforts to monitor progress on advancing universal health coverage (UHC) and health-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the South-East Asia region.

IAPO commends the **ninth annual report** on tracking Member States' progress toward achieving UHC and the health-related SDGs. This report represents a vital step towards a healthier, more equitable future for all in the region.

We particularly appreciate the report's updates on health outcomes in the region and emphasize the importance of actively involving patients, communities, and people with lived experiences in policy design and implementation.
