



SITUATION IN NUMBERS





HIGHLIGHTS

- Since the last edition of the weekly situation report, the Ministry of Health (MoH) reported 8
 new cases of COVID-19, 9 recoveries and 0 deaths. The number of new cases and deaths has
 been remaining low.
- Ten international consultants have been deployed to 10 municipalities to extend the support on the ground to the health workers to accelerate the COVID-19 vaccine in the country as well as routine immunization.
- With funding support from the European Union (EU), WHO Timor-Leste handed over several boxes of consumables for laboratory testing. These items will be used for conducting microbiology and molecular biology tests in the National Health Laboratory, including COVID-19 PCR tests.
- TLHIS- CIT database was launched on 7th April 2021 in Timor-Leste along with the COVID-19 vaccination campaign and it is being used successfully to monitor the progress of the COVID-19 vaccination campaign. However, with the introduction of Pfizer vaccine in October 2021, several changes were made to the system and refresher training are being conducted for

both HMIS and EPI staff in the field. The first refresher training was conducted in Viqueque municipality on 23rd November 2021 with the participation from the municipality health office and from all the sub-districts. In addition to data entry, participants were trained on data analytics and data quality assessment.

- As a part of the World Antimicrobial Awareness Week (WAAW) celebration, WHO Timor-Leste, the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and Menzies School of Health Research organized an antimicrobial resistance awareness event on 20 November and lighting up Cristo Rei in blue to join the Go Blue for AMR campaign worldwide. More than 400 participants participated the event, who are from government ministries, NGOs and universities (medical, nursing and midwifery students), as well as the public.
- WHO Timor-Leste supported The Ministry of Health Department of Maternal and Child health under the aegis of the National Directorate of Saúde na Familia conducted 3-days orientation on New-born Birth Defects online surveillance system to all 5 Referral Hospitals directors including HNGV, head of maternity and paediatric department from all 5 referral hospitals and HNGV. The orientation also provided the overall information on NBBD, ICD 10 coding and the system SOP's.
- The National Directorate for Hospital Services, through financial support from the WHO
 Timor-Leste, conducted a two-day meeting to evaluate the activities implemented in 2021,
 including COVID-19 case management. The primary aim of the meeting is to assess the
 achievement made, challenges, identify priorities and better plan for 2022. Directors from
 the hospital support services and referral hospitals attended the meeting.
- WHO supported the Sanitary Vigilance and Environmental Health Department, MoH
 conducted training orientation to more than 119 health workers (sanitary focal points,
 cleaners, and nurses) on health care waste management including infection, prevention, and
 control (IPC) in six municipalities between October to 23rd November 2021.
- Pillar 2 team together with health inspectors, as per the Strategic Preparedness and Response Plan (SPRP), for COVID-19 response under the MOH continues to conduct regular community health inspections for COVID-19 prevention and other health measures in Dili municipality targeting health care facilities, schools, markets, worship places, shopping centers and other public spaces.
- WHO continues to support the MOH through one of its implementing partners, SABEH, to
 carry out medical outreach consultation and domiciliary visits in the municipalities. Within
 three weeks of November the medical outreach has reached a total of 1,403 patients. Of the
 1,403, about 539 patients from Dili municipality in collaboration with Dili Municipality Health
 Services and 864 patients were benefitted from the services at three sub-districts from

Bobonaro and Covalima municipality. In addition to medical outreach, the team also supported the vaccination drive and reached 1,126 people in Lourba, Bobonaro municipality.

WHO with partners (Maluk Timor and Menzies School of Health Research) supported the
International Annual Health Scientific Conference in Timor-Leste (16-17 November 2021)
covering clinical management, laboratory support and epidemiology and public health topics
including COVID-19 pandemic policy and strategy, risk communication, prevention, control,
laboratory testing and clinical care.


- There are 8 new cases reported during the current reporting period (17 23 Nov 2021). The number of new cases has remained the same as compared with the previous reporting period (10-16 Nov 2021). Incident cases are reported from Dili, Bobonaro and Covalima municipalities.
- No death has been reported from Timor-Leste during this reporting period, which is the third consecutive reporting period with no death reported.

• The number of active cases dropped to 7.


2. Number of test and test positivity rates

- During the current reporting period from 17 to 23 November, 1,262 tests were conducted, as compared to 1,118 tests in the previous 7 days.
- The test positive rates of this reporting period averaged to 0.6%, a 11% reduction as compared with the previous reporting period.

CASE MANAGEMENT



The isolation centre admissions in Dili continued to decrease steadily throughout November 2021. The numbers admitted to critical care isolation centres (Lahane and Vera Cruz) have been between 0-2. Since late August 2021, there has been an overall decrease of 99.9% in admissions in Dili isolation centres.



This chart shows the total number of people admitted to isolation centres and auto-isolation (at home) in 12 municipalities compared to Dili. Throughout Timor-Leste, patients admitted to isolation centres have steadily decreased.

VACCINATION

At the time of writing this report (23/11/2021 morning), in total, 1,061,523 COVID-19 vaccine doses comprising 634,575 first doses (coverage 79.7% among population aged 18 years and above and 18.4% among the population aged 12 years to <18 years) and 427,083 second doses (coverage 55.7% among population aged 18 years and above) were administered in Timor-Leste. The breakdown of the number of doses administered and coverage by vaccine product and vaccine dose is illustrated in Table 1.




Figure 1: Coverage of COVID-19 vaccination by municipality in Timor-Leste as of 10:00hrs 23/11/2021






Figure 2: Weekly progress of vaccination in Timor-Leste during as of 10:00 hrs 21/11/2021

SITUATION ANALYSIS

- The transmission of COVID-19 continues to remain at a low level in Timor-Leste, as
 evidenced by the record low level of incident cases, test positivity rates and zero deaths
 (for three consecutive reporting periods).
- The state of emergency is unlikely to be extended beyond the current expiry date according to the news report. However, a government decree law to enforce public health measures during the public health emergency has been passed and will be implemented. This will guarantee the continuing implementation of quarantine and surveillance measures. It is expected that the movements of people will be increased, while the use of masks and hand washing decreased. The public should continue to take these measures as part of the "new normal" and get the vaccination if they haven't done so. At the same time, policies and procedures should be updated on entering the territory, testing, quarantine and isolations to accommodate the new developments.
- Remember: the pandemic is not yet over, and the cases are surging in some parts of the world. We should continue to be vigilant!
