Key messages

WHO estimates that, in 2010, about 44% of Timor-Leste's population aged 15 years and older were current tobacco users (approximately 275,200 people). If tobacco control efforts continue at the same intensity, WHO projects that in 2025 around 32% of the population aged 15 years and older (approximately 265,600 people) will be tobacco users.

WHO estimates that, in 2010, about 76% of men and about 12% of women aged 15 years and older in Timor-Leste were using tobacco either daily or occasionally. WHO projects that by 2025 the rate will be approximately 55% for men and 8% for women.

In 2010, the highest rate of smoking among men was seen in the age-group ≥ 70, and among women the highest rate was seen in the same age-group.

WHO Member States adopted a voluntary global target to reduce use of tobacco (smoking and smokeless combined) by 30% by 2025. If Timor-Leste adopts this global target, the results indicate that, based on current trends, Timor-Leste is unlikely to achieve the target.
