12.1 Chemical contaminants in drinking-water

1,2-Dichloroethene

History of guideline development

The 1958, 1963 and 1971 WHO *International Standards for Drinking-water* did not refer to 1,2-dichloroethene. In the first edition of the *Guidelines for Drinking-water Quality*, published in 1984, no guideline value was recommended after a detailed evaluation of the compound. In the 1993 Guidelines, a joint guideline value of 0.05 mg/l was calculated for both 1,2-dichloroethene isomers using toxicity data on the *trans* isomer. This guideline value was brought forward to the third edition of the Guidelines, published in 2004, and the fourth edition of the Guidelines, published in 2011.
