## Toluene

## History of guideline development

The 1958, 1963 and 1971 WHO *International Standards for Drinking-water* did not refer to toluene. In the first edition of the *Guidelines for Drinking-water Quality*, published in 1984, no guideline value was recommended after a detailed evaluation of the compound. The 1993 Guidelines established a health-based guideline value of 0.7 mg/l for toluene, but noted that this value exceeds the lowest reported odour threshold for toluene in water (0.024 mg/l). This guideline value was brought forward to the third edition of the Guidelines, published in 2004, and the fourth edition of the Guidelines, published in 2011.
