Statement on the Integration of Acupuncture and Traditional Chinese Medicine Herbs in the Prevention and Treatment of Infectious Diseases Amidst Rising Antimicrobial Resistance in the WHO European Region 2023-2030

As the world grapples with the formidable challenge of antimicrobial resistance (AMR), it is imperative that we explore innovative and holistic approaches to prevent and treat infectious diseases. The rise of AMR poses a significant threat to global public health, necessitating a multifaceted approach that leverages the strengths of various medical traditions. In this statement, we advocate for the inclusion of acupuncture and Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) herbs as valuable adjunctive therapies in the prevention and treatment of infectious diseases.

The contemporary landscape of infectious diseases demands a comprehensive response that extends beyond conventional antibiotics and pharmaceuticals. Acupuncture and TCM have been utilized for thousands of years and offer a wealth of knowledge and therapeutic tools that can contribute to this global effort. We assert that integrating these traditional modalities into mainstream medical practices can enhance the effectiveness of our strategies against infectious diseases and help mitigate the growing AMR crisis.

We urge the World Health Organization and its European Committee to consider the following recommendations in the development of policies addressing infectious diseases and AMR:

- Recognition and Integration: Acknowledge the value of acupuncture and TCM herbs as integral components of infectious disease prevention and treatment.
- Multidisciplinary Guidelines: Develop guidelines that incorporate both traditional and modern medical approaches, fostering a more holistic and effective strategy against infectious diseases.
- Promotion of Research: Advocate for increased funding and support for research on acupuncture and TCM's role in infectious disease management.
- Capacity Building: Encourage the development of training programs and support systems for healthcare professionals to expand their knowledge of these traditional
